LYNN'S CORNER



CLOSUE OF PORTION OF BRIDLE MAIN TRAIL

This is a section of Main trail along the 134 E, on the Griffith Park side of the freeway. It will be closed in order to do installation of a reclaimed water line for the Park.

This will temporarily close the Equestrian underpass at Tunnel # 5 and Tunnel # 6. Tunnel 6 is the tunnel near the Live Steamers, bottom of the Rattlesnake Trail. Tunnel 5 goes under the Victory Street bridge to Pecan Grove, on the way to the Autry and Ranger Station.

The Tunnel closures start on Monday September 21 thru Friday October 16 2015.

Detour signs will be installed well in advance of of the affected areas so that the riders can re-route or turn around before the reach the closed areas. Riders can use Tunnels #3 and #4 (also know as the Patterson Tunnels) to connect from the Skyline Trail to bypass the Construction zone.

EL NINO

A reminder to riders not to ride on the edge of the trail after rains. The ground is very soft and could give way, leading to a disaster. Several years ago, after a rain, I was riding at a considerable distance behind a rider heading down Skyline.

She seemed to be day dreaming, enjoying the distant scenery, but seemed to be unaware that her horse was treading on the very edge of the trail, with a huge drop off into the canyon below. I couldn't reach her in time to warn her, and probably my opinion wouldn't have been received kindly. However, it was scary and foolish of this person to ride on the soft edge.

Recently, in September, in Oak Canyon, an evening rider was too close to the edge of the trail. The softened ground gave way, the whole horse fell into the hole, partially pinning the rider as well. They escaped with minor cuts and bruises, but they were lucky.

For your own safety and that of your horse, pay attention to where you are on the trail.

AUTOMOBILE TRAFFIC

Many cars, both morning and evening, use the park roads as alternative routes for the 134 and the 5 freeways. They are in a hurry to get to work or to return home after work.

There has been concerns about problems with cars not stopping for equestrians trying to cross the street at Skyline, and the crosswalk at the Parks reclamation/recycling area. The old striping to warm motorist of horse crossing has been worn away over the years. RAP is now looking at new striping to mark the horse crossings, also looking at enhanced signage to warn vehicles. LAPD and the Rangers will be patrolling these areas and ticketing speeding cars.

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO PUT ON A HORSE SHOW?

Horse Show Timeline

At lease 3 Months in advance:

- Decide on the date, location and type of show.
- Start getting your show committee together.

As soon as possible after determining the date, etc.

- Start getting the word out.
- Hire your judge, announcer and any other officials needed
- Determine your class list

6 to 8 weeks in advance

- Order the ribbons and other prizes
- Start getting your show materials together both secretarial and ring

3 to 4 weeks in advance

• Finalize your volunteers – make sure you have a few in reserve

1 to 2 weeks in advance

• Have a meeting of the show committee to make sure you have everything organized

• Contact the local rescue squad to give them a heads-up that you are having the show and make sure they know the exact location.

• Visit the show facility to inspect the grounds and make sure there is nothing else you need to provide for the show.

The day before the show

- Do a final safety inspection of the show grounds.
- Make sure you have all your show forms and show supplies.
- Pray for good weather

The day of the show

• Show up and have fun.

She is missed by all the gals who knew her.




ETI Corral 38 Would Like Your Input!
